



# RED HILL HIGHLIGHTS

The mission of Navy Closure Task Force-Red Hill (NCTF-RH) is to execute the permanent decommissioning of the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility (RHBFSF) safely and expeditiously, and continue long-term environmental remediation in coordination with State and Federal regulators in order to protect public health and the environment.

## NCTF-RH Provides Update to Hawaii Gov. Josh Green

As part of Navy Closure Task Force-Red Hill's (NCTF-RH) ongoing commitment to engaging with the community and stakeholders, the NCTF-RH team provided an update to Gov. Josh Green on June 6.

The team discussed continuing to work with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Hawaii Department of Health (DOH) to return the Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam back to regular drinking water compliance monitoring after more than three years of Long-Term Monitoring and Extended Drinking Water Monitoring, and reactivation of the Navy Aiea-Halawa Shaft.




## NCTF-RH Provides Tank Cleaning Progress Update

NCTF-RH continues tank cleaning operations to safely and deliberately decommission the underground storage tanks and close the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility.

Tank cleaning operations of Tanks 7 and 8 are complete, in accordance with the EPA and DOH approved tank cleaning plan and are pending regulatory approval of their cleanliness validation reports.

Work is underway in Tanks 3 and 4 including installation and inspection of infrastructure before pressure washing. Tanks 5 and 6 are set to begin pressure washing operations in the coming weeks. The NCTF-RH team completed degassing and sludge removal operations in the tanks earlier this year.
