



RED HILL HIGHLIGHTS

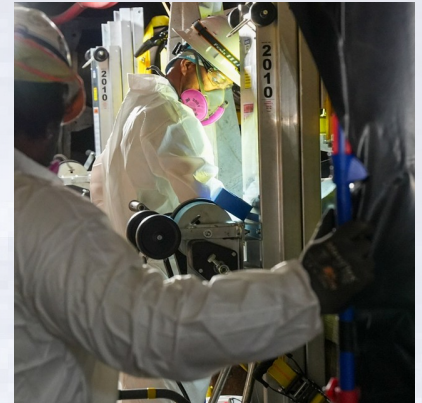

The mission of Navy Closure Task Force-Red Hill (NCTF-RH) is to execute the permanent decommissioning of the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility (RHBFSS) safely and expeditiously, and continue long-term environmental remediation in coordination with State and Federal regulators in order to protect public health and the environment.

Preparations Continue for Red Hill Pipeline Removal

Earlier this month, Navy Closure Task Force-Red Hill (NCTF-RH) began cutting pipes at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility (RHBFSS) to facilitate completion of pipeline cleaning. This is another major step towards NCTF-RH's efforts to close the facility.

On April 30, the EPA approved the Navy's plan to recycle decommissioned steel pipeline material from the RHBFSS. This approval allows the Navy to begin safely removing pipeline from the facility and transporting it to a smelter in Texas, where it will be melted down and recycled. The plan also reinforces the Navy's commitment to public safety and environmental responsibility.

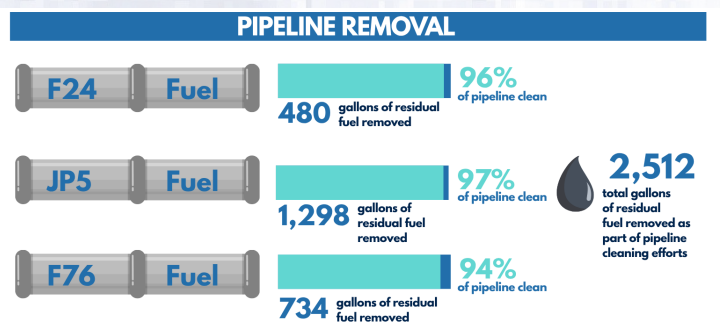
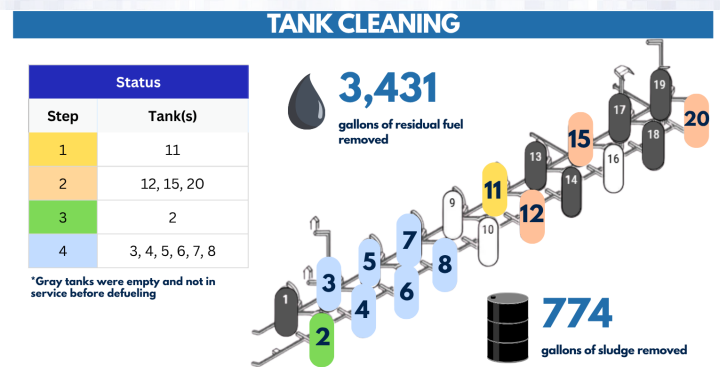


NCTF-RH Dashboards Show Status of Tank Cleaning and Pipeline Removal

NCTF-RH continues to make significant strides in decommissioning the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, having safely removed over 6,500 gallons of residual fuel and sludge to date. In addition, the facility's three main fuel pipelines are now over 96% clean.

The NCTF-RH dashboard provides a visual representation of the Tank Cleaning and Pipeline Removal status. Tank Cleaning is broken down into four main stages: 1) Preparation, 2) Solid Sludge Removal, 3) Pressure Washing, and 4) Decommissioning. The Pipeline Removal dashboard shows the amount of residual fuel and sludge removed and the current stage of each pipeline in the process.

NCTF-RH provides these updates to the public as part of the Navy's continued commitment to keeping the community informed.
